principles and missional concepts of Ephesians. And that's to name a few. These sections and supporting biblical analysis are a goldmine for missiology and biblical studies.

Given the book is a reworking of a PhD thesis in missiology for a South African university, I was surprised the book did not engage more with African scholarship. Many Africans on the African continent and in the African diaspora are writing about missiological and biblical issues Van Aarde could have profitably explored in this book, but he mainly consults Western scholars. Perhaps he can engage more African scholars in subsequent works.

This book is an original and valuable contribution to missiology and biblical studies, and Van Aarde should be congratulated on this outstanding work.
